We receive ashes as a way of remembering that “you are dust and to dust you shall return” (Genesis 3:19).

Lent continues for 40 days (a significant amount of time in the Bible representing a time of testing, trial, purification, or transformation. Jesus himself spent 40 days in the wilderness where he fasted and endured temptation from the devil (Matthew 4:1-11).

During this season we will travel with Jesus, hear the stories of Jesus' life leading to the cross, and join with brothers and sisters from our St. Andrew's UCC and St. Stephen's UCC on Wednesdays to encourage one another on the journey (see page 3 for more details).

Lay Reader for February: Nancy Ziegenfuss

February 1 | Fourth Sunday after the Epiphany

Text: *Matthew 5:1-12*

Sermon: **Who is Blessed?**

Jesus started his most famous sermon with a series of “Blessed are the _____.” We can learn a lot about God’s plan for his people through these *Beatitudes*.

February 8 | Fifth Sunday after the Epiphany

Text: *1 Corinthians 2:1-16*

Sermon: **The Mind of Christ**

The Apostle Paul reflected on his ministry with the Corinthians and shared with them that he there was a single organizing principle to his whole approach. He resolved to know nothing while he was among them, “except Jesus Christ, and him crucified.” Giving up strength and wisdom as the world knows it, he talked about having the mind of Christ.

February 15 | Transfiguration Sunday

Text: *Matthew 17:1-9*

Sermon: **Transfigured Before Them**

On Transfiguration Sunday we listen to the story of how Jesus brought Peter, James, and John up a mountain and was transfigured before them.

Wednesday, February 18 at 7:00 pm | Ash Wednesday

Text: *Psalm 51:1-17, Joel 2:1-2, 12-17, 2 Corinthians 5:20b-6:10*, Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21*

Sermon: **Be Reconciled to God**

Lent begins with Ashes and repentance and the call to be reconciled to God.

February 22 | First Sunday in Lent Communion

Text: *Matthew 4:1-11*

Sermon: **Jesus Was Tempted**

On the first Sunday in Lent we hear about how Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness where he was tempted by the devil. What are we to make of this strange story?





WE ARE . . . THE KEYSTONE CONFERENCE, UCC!

The Keystone Conference of the United Church of Christ was formed by the merger of the four Pennsylvania Conferences – Penn Central, Penn Northeast, Pennsylvania Southeast and Penn West. These Conferences had started in 1962, soon after the birth of the United Church of Christ in 1957. The Keystone Conference UCC was formed on January 1, 2026 and is now one of 38 regional bodies of the United Church of Christ.



Pastor Steven attended a “service of release” on Sunday, January 4, in which our former Conference Minister, the Rev. Bill Worley, after 11 years of faithful service to the Pennsylvania Southeast Conference of the UCC, stepped down and was released from his role as our conference minister. It was much like the service of release for Pastor Trudy last April, but was attended by many pastors!

Our new Transitional Executive Conference Minister is the **Rev. Dr. Carrie Call** (pictured right) who previously served as the conference minister of the Penn Central Conference UCC. She served there from 2019-2025. Before that she served at Lancaster Theological Seminary as Executive Director of Development and Communication.


