

### A FINAL NOTE FROM PASTOR TRUDY

The weeks of Lent are quickly passing us by and we begin to look ahead now to Holy Week – the shouts of 'hosanna' and the 'waving of palms' are before us – the shouts of 'crucify Him' follow close behind as we approach the cross and remember our Savior's betrayal and crucifixion. But, oh, how blessed we are as we remember our faith story does not end on Good Friday! No, the words I hear and the song I hear calling to us loud and clear is that He Lives – we serve a Risen Savior!

From those shouts of 'hosanna' - as Jesus entered Jerusalem - until the night of His betrayal - Jesus was in teaching mode with His disciples – by His words and actions. The inspired Word of God as it comes to us through John's Gospel – gives us what Bible scholars call Jesus' 'farewell discourse' (John 13:1-17:26) – Jesus' final testament as He instructs His disciples about maintaining faithful discipleship when He is not physically present.

The 'farewell discourse' in John's Gospel gives us the stories of Jesus kneeling at the feet of His disciples and washing their feet and Jesus giving a new commandment, 'that you love one another – just as I have loved you.' In this final testament, Jesus promises His disciples that even when He is no longer physically present with them - God will send a Helper - an Advocate – the Holy Spirit – the Spirit of Truth – to lead and guide them. He speaks of how their sorrow will turn into joy. Jesus knows of the troubles of the world and the hatred in the world and the pain, heartache, sorrow, struggles and difficult moments that His followers will face. And at the end of His final testament Jesus prays for His disciples (John 17:1-26) twenty-six verses of Jesus in prayer on behalf of His disciples - praying 'that they may all be one.' Like all scripture, 'these things are written so that you will believe that Jesus is the Christ, God's Son, and that believing, you will have life in his name' (John 20:31). How wonderful for these stories to have been passed on to us through God's Holy Word – passed on from one generation to another!!!

We have been blessed and have written many stories together over these past five-and-a-half years; another chapter in the book of St. Paul's United Church of Christ's long history. But we aren't guite finished yet! We have a few more stories to write as we walk together through these last weeks of serving Christ as pastor and people. We will journey together through Holy Week and remember all that Christ has done for us. We will gather together and weep at the thought once more that The Perfect One, God's Son, suffered and died for us. But our sorrow will turn to joy when we gather on that glorious Easter morning - proclaiming: He is risen! He is risen indeed; also gathering at the Table as one to share in the broken bread and the cup of blessing; and witnessing the Rite of Confirmation for Jaxon Moyer and Simon Ziegenfuss. What a day of celebration it will be! With each final word of our story - in each final moment of the time we will share together - let us remember God called us together in His time for a certain length of time - to be in service to His Son, our Risen Savior - who continues to teach us to love; to lead us by the movement of the Holy Spirit, Our Helper and Guide; to yes, pray for us from God's heavenly throne; and to believe that Jesus is the Christ, God's Son, and that believing, we will have life in his name! It has been my great and humble privilege to serve as your pastor and to be a part of your story! God be with you until we meet again!

As we move through the final weeks of Lent, we will hear more familiar stories including the story of that famous tax collector, Zaccheus! Perhaps you grew up singing "Zaccheus was a wee little man" in Sunday School. So many of these scriptures hold significance in pop culture, church history, politics, and everything in between.

Through all these familiar stories we have explored and will continue to explore, Jesus emphasizes the radical, inclusive, and surprising love of God.

Join us in these remaining weeks of Lent – journey with us to the cross in Holy Week – as St. Paul's, St. Andrew's and St. Stephen's join together to explore and experience Lent and Holy Week 2025.

## A MESSAGE FROM THE CONSISTORY PRESIDENT

Dear St. Paul's Members,

I regretfully inform you that effective March 10, 2025, our Christian Education Director, Jeremiah Link has resigned. We have greatly appreciated Jeremiah's work with our youth each Sunday. He will be sorely missed, and we wish him well in his future endeavors. Unfortunately, beginning Sunday, March 16, we will not have Children's Chat as part of our worship service, and Kingdom Kids and Sunday School for older youth will be suspended until further notice. Pastor Trudy will provide a Children's Bulletin based on the theme of the service which will be available to any children attending services during our time of transition.

I would also like to keep you updated on the progress of finding a new pastor. Consistory, as the transition team, has sent to the PSEC a description of what we would like a "bridge" pastor to do for us. Our "bridge" pastor will be appointed by the conference to be responsible for basic pastoral leadership including preaching, visiting our sick and shut-ins, performing weddings, baptisms, funerals, and serving communion We anticipate that the "bridge" pastor will serve us for 3 to 8 months following Pastor Trudy's departure. We have also begun working on the "short profile" of our church which we will be use to select an interim pastor.

As hurricanes, floods and other disasters become more frequent, the road to recovery can feel overwhelming. Your support fills CWS Emergency Cleanup Buckets with the essential supplies that make cleanup a little easier for those affected. This year, CWS (Church World Service) has updated the bucket to streamline the contents and keep it as effective and budget-friendly as possible.

Each of our three midweek Lenten host churches during the season of Lent will be putting together a Church World Service (CWS) Cleanup Bucket (one, two, or more). Select any of the items below and place them in the collection bin located in the narthex area and marked CWS Cleanup Buckets. An inventory of the items will be taken mid-Lent and the collection list updated as to the items that are still needed to complete a bucket or two or three. Thank you for your prayerful consideration of each donated item.

- Five scouring pads (No stainless steel or pads with soap in them. Remove from packaging.)
- Seven sponges, including one large
- One scrub brush (With or without handle.)
- 18 reusable, lightweight multipurpose cleaning towels (Not paper towels. Remove from packaging.)
- One 16-34oz bottle of liquid dish soap (antibacterial preferred)
- One 12-40oz bottle of liquid concentrate household cleaner that can be mixed with water (No spray bottles.)
- One 50-100ft clothesline (Cotton or plastic line.)
- Five dust masks (N95 particulate respirator dust masks preferred; No surgical masks.)
- Two pairs of heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (Latex-free preferred. Durable for multiple use. Remove from packaging.)
- One pair of heavy-duty, reusable work gloves (Such as nitrile, cotton with leather palm, or all leather.)
- 20-28 heavy-duty or contractor-type 30-45 gallon trash bags on a roll (Remove from packaging.)

All cleaning items must be new and all liquid items must be capped and securely tightened.
