## A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Arden Mead and King Schoenfeld in their book, "I Love to Live The Story: A Guide to Understanding & Celebrating The Christian Church Year," share with us these words regarding the season of Easter: On the Day of Easter the whole Church throughout the world and all time rises with its Lord; alive as Jesus is alive; free of the burden of sin and death as Jesus is free; full of hope and expectation, for a loving Lord reigns over life and eternity! Our world has changed; we are different. What we need now is time to let this "all sink in." Fortunately, just as Lent is a season, so Easter is a season as well, an even longer one. As the Church celebrates the Great Fifty Days of Easter, it may be hard to keep the momentum going – but it should be worth the effort.

You bet it's worth the effort to keep the Easter momentum going! How wonderful to recognize in this season of Spring – surrounded by the bursting forth of new life – that every Sunday – is a 'little Easter'!!!! And that, every week, every Sunday, Christians all over the world gather to worship together. We pray – we listen – we sing! In some traditions, like ours, there is an Order of Service bulletin which tells people what will happen during the worship service. In our Order of Service, we gather and get ready to worship. We listen for God's message. We show that we want live God's way. We are sent out into the world to love God and to be a blessing. But there are other worship settings that I've experienced, especially in Ghana, West Africa, where there is no Order of Service; the worship unfolds as it will, with much singing and dancing and yes, even food and beverages passed around and eaten during the time of worship. But whatever the style of worship – each Sunday – each time we gather for worship – is a way of being with God – and is like a celebration of the good news of Easter! And I believe – with or without an Order of Service - in our own ways - in our own traditions - we gather - we listen for God's message - we respond with our tithes and offerings - and we leave our time of our respective times of worship - to enter God's world to love God and to *be* a blessing!

Sunday is the day of celebration and worship for Christians because of Christ's glorious resurrection......Sunday, the day when the women discovered that the tomb where Jesus had been buried was empty, and Jesus was risen. And now in this season of Easter, as Mead and Schoenfeld also write: we will experience weekly confrontations with the Risen Christ as the Scripture readings become a kind of "foretaste of the feast to come," a celebration of our togetherness as the family of God – looking forward to feasting with the Lord eternally at his heavenly banquet.

Come pray – come listen – come sing – come and worship! Christ is risen! Alleluia!

# JAMES FRANTZ DEDICATION AWARD

On Celebration Sunday this award will be given to a young person between the ages of 13 and 19 who exemplifies dedication to the church, similar to that which was shown by the late Jim Frantz. Jim was a lifelong member of St. Paul's from 1919 through 1999. Last year's award recipient was *Tessa Hawkins*.

Nominations can be made by any St. Paul's member on our website. If you're unable to use the online form., there are forms in the Narthex. Submit your nomination online or to Rick Moyer's mailbox by May 1st.

The award will be a monetary gift from a CD we have invested and will be donated to a charity of the recipient's

choice in his/her name. The recipient's name will be placed on the James Frantz Dedication Award plaque located in Fretz Hall.

We have some wonderful youth who are just beginning their lives as church members. Nominees should show dedication to the life of the church in such ways as volunteering at church activities, church event and worship attendance, etc. Let's support them and their efforts.

#### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

## **CONFIRMATION CLASS OF 2025**

Confirmation classes are open to our young people in 6<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grades that are ready to enter this time of faith formation. In the United Church of Christ, when an infant or young child is baptized, one or both parents and/or one or more sponsors promises to assume certain responsibilities for the Christian nurture of the baptized. The entire congregation also assumes the role of sponsors as its members promise to provide a supportive Christian community in which a child may grow in awareness and understanding concerning the meaning of life in Christ. At the end of the faith formation sessions (May 2025) – each confirmand decides if they are ready to make public agreement to the baptismal promises previously made by their parent(s). Look for details in our May newsletter. Registration will begin in June. Information regarding mentors will also be included.


