
After visiting Bethlehem for the seventh time in February of 1998, Rev. Thomas Pilgrim put together the worship series, "They Came Together in Bethlehem." Since our worship services are now live-streamed, I reached out to Pastor Tom and he graciously provided written copyright permission for our use of his timeless resource created for the Advent/Christmas season. In the Preface to the series, Pastor Tom writes: "Each time I go there I am impressed by the fact that people from all over the world come together in Bethlehem. As I thought about this on one of my trips there, I realized it is not just people who come together in Bethlehem. Many things come together in Bethlehem. The great purposes of God come together in Bethlehem. As we sing, the hopes and fears of all the years come together in Bethlehem. And for all of us, life comes together in Bethlehem because of what happened there on a cold, dark night when a star lit up the sky and God's love warmed the hearts of a few people who came together in Bethlehem."

As our Hanging of the Greens service concludes on the First Sunday of Advent, December 3rd, we will be introduced in detail to our Advent/Christmas season theme, "*They Came Together in Bethlehem*." We will also meet the first of *The Beholders*, <u>The Prophet</u>; we will hear from a different *Beholder*, at the conclusion of every worship service throughout Advent and Christmas. Our *Kingdom Kids* will assist in the lighting of our Advent Candles throughout the season of Advent; and together with *Kingdom Kids* we will learn about the meaning and significance of The Chrismons.

If you pay attention as you explore the pages of this newsletter, you will find those many and varied opportunities – worship, activities, special events – all to prepare us for the celebration of our Savior's birth. May we come together at St. Paul's United Church of Christ in this time of waiting and anticipation – because in our waiting for the celebration of our Savior's birth – Advent also reminds us that we await our Savior's Second Coming too! 

Students in grades 5 through 12 are invited to join us for ReCharge on **Sunday**, **December 10**, **6:30** – **8:30pm**. We'll be busy that night with all sorts of activities! ReCharge will not meet on our regularly scheduled Sunday in December – the last Sunday of the month – because of New Year's Eve; however, we will be back on our usual schedule in January.



SPAGHETTI DINNER

ReCharge cooked up a delicious, comforting meal on November 11. A big thank you to those who came out to eat and who brought donations for FISH. Together we were able to donate several bags of pantry items and close to \$200!





We are currently still working out of three pantries, St. Paul's UCC, Blooming Glen Mennonite Church and Souderton Brethren in Christ Church, serving a total of 250 children each week. Our pantry in the Green Room, serves 102 children every week! We serve West Rockhill Elementary, Deibler Elementary, South Middle School and Pennridge High School.

We have six different packing teams that rotate through a schedule filling the bags each week. We have four different delivery people who come each week and pick up the bins to deliver to the schools. Kevin gives his own time to break down all the cardboard and take out the trash every week!

We are still looking for donations of dry snacks to put in the bags such as Doritos, Potato Chips, Fritos, Pringles, etc. Those snacks are "extras" and very appreciated by our children. A typical weekend bag contains two breakfasts

(such as oatmeal, a protein bar, fruit, dry cereal), two lunches (such as a can of beef ravioli, Rice-A-Roni, a can of soup, crackers, tuna or chicken salad) and two snacks (such as a granola bar, fruit, peanuts, popcorn). On a weekend that includes a day off or on a longer vacation, we supply enough food to cover all the days they are not in school.

Our food buyer works diligently to stretch our dollars. She shops with a BJs card that earns us points toward food at BJs. We buy most of our food at Sam's, Walmart, and Amazon. She has been able to keep the cost of a typical weekend bag to \$8/9. But that means we are spending around \$10,125/month.

So far, we have been totally funded by local churches, service organizations and individuals. We are beginning to seek business sponsorships and corporate sponsors for our first ever fundraising event coming to Sellersville on Sunday, April 28! Look for more details in January. Our first dine-in Chicken Potpie Dinner since 2019 was a big success!

We did not have as many people dine in as we have had in the past, but our takeout sales made up for it. It was a beautiful Halloween weekend with many other activities going on around the community which may explain our low turnout.

The promotion of the dinner was really stepped up this year with the addition of Brianna's design and marketing skills.

However, we continue our tradition of making our own noodles with the help of many church members.

Gerry Milkowich created centerpieces for all the tables which she donated for future fall activities at St. Paul's. We had servers, waiters, and bussers as well as our greeter, Pastor Trudy, and our money takers and hostess. Many people worked behind the scenes setting up the room, putting leftover potpie in quart containers for takeout, cooking and cutting chicken, cutting vegetables, and of course cooking the potpie the day of the dinner. There was a multitude of delicious desserts donated and carefully cut and served at the dinner. The dishwashers and cleanup crew did a great job of wrapping it all up. It is truly a labor of love and fellowship!

Our profit of \$2000 will go into the checking account at St. Paul's to help with our finances at the church.

A big thank you goes out to ALL who helped make this happen.
