## PENNRIDGE CROP WALK UPDATE

The 42nd annual Pennridge CROP Walk/Rock for Hunger was held on Sunday, October 12, 2025.

Here is an update about the Pennridge Crop Walk. There were walkers and rockers from 17 congregations that helped surpass the goal of \$25,500 by nearly \$2,000. So far, the donations received totaled \$27,483.35 have been received. That means Pennridge FISH will receive \$6,870 from the CROP Walk and the remaining funds will go to Church World Service to help end hunger in the U.S. and around the world.

St. Paul's had 9 walkers and 2 dogs participating in the CROP Walk. (I apologize for missing Joselyn in the previous count). St. Paul's raised \$2,736 which included \$1,000 from the Endowment Committee. A sincere thank you to everyone who walked and donated to the CROP Walk to help end hunger locally and worldwide. Also, a thank you to the Endowment Committee for their generous donation.

### **OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD THANKS**




Thank you to everyone who packed a shoebox for Operation Christmas Child. This year we collected 30 shoeboxes!

We invite you to make worship at St. Paul's an important part of your family's experience of Christmas this year.


