

~ A Note from the Pastor ~

The month of February brings us to the end of the church season after the Epiphany and the celebration of The Transfiguration and leads us into, yes, the church season of Lent which begins with Ash Wednesday on February 22nd. *This Season of Lent begins in the wilderness, a place that feels both familiar and dreaded after the recent pandemic. While we might emphasize the loneliness and desolation of the wilderness, wilderness times are not just empty and barren. Just as a wilderness can be teeming with life, our wilderness times can also surprise us with the life they hold. Our lives can also feel clarifying and renewed as we find within ourselves new awareness.

We will begin Lent in the familiar landscape of the wilderness with the tempter's questions to Jesus. That growing awareness during Lent shifts from Jesus to Nicodemus' assurance of God's deep care and self-giving love in the winds of change and new birth. We continue to find a new awareness of ourselves in the questions asked of and by the Samaritan woman and by the one blind in the gospel of John. If we didn't notice it before, we begin to notice that there are companions in the wilderness who encourage our survival.

Will we be companions in the wilderness? Will we encourage not only each other's survival, but will be alert to that new awareness that we seek to find within ourselves: a deeper awareness of God's call on our lives; a deeper awareness of God's self-giving love for you and for me in the winds of change and new birth; a deeper awareness of God's desire for us to grow closer to *The Church's One Foundation* which is *Jesus Christ Her Lord*? Will you join the Lenten journey this year?

In addition, hundreds of thousands of youth have experienced for themselves the joy and satisfaction of giving and serving, inspiring people of all ages to follow their generous example.
