

FROM THE PASTOR

On January 6, the church moves from the season of Christmas into another season in the life of the church, the season of Epiphany. You remember those astrologers, also referred to as kings, from the Near East that scripture tells us "followed the star they had seen in the east.....until it stood over the place where the child was." (Matthew 2:9b). Epiphany is a Greek word meaning "appearing" or "revealing" – the discovery of the child by these travelers from the Near East is called the revealing of God in his Son to the nations of the world; and so, the Day of Epiphany opens a season of light – the Lord's light – that has entered the lives of humanity in all the world. The New Testament calls Jesus the Light of the World: Jesus Christ who brings us into a right relation with his Father through knowledge, healing and salvation.

Joyce Rupp and Macrina Wiederkehr in their book, "The Circle of Life: The Heart's Journey Through the Seasons" recommend a Star Shining Ritual. They refer to the birth of Christ as the coming of the Christ-Star into the world. They write, "It is a time to remember how God's Beloved came to restore harmony to a fractured world, to dispel whatever keeps love from shining through all beings. The Christ-Star, this Irresistible Love in us, this Radiant Goodness, is at the core of our soul......each of us has the light of this Shining Star within us."

In the Star Shining Ritual hold a lit candle (battery operated is suggested and acceptable). Stand and face the direction of East. Hold the candle in front of your heart to signify that you have Divine Love shining within you. Next, hold the candle out in front of you as far as possible, signifying an offering of this Love and Light to all people who dwell in the East. As you hold out your candle, name aloud the various groups of people who live in the East as a way of uniting with them. After this, offer this prayer: Star of Love, shine your goodness through me. Star of Love, unite my heart with the heart of the world. This same pattern is simply repeated for the other three directions: south, west, and north.

After you have prayed in every direction, once more hold the candle to your heart and then move it slowly in a circle in front of you. Hold the light for family, friends, all loved ones, all who are a part of your circle of life. Send the light and love of the Star-Light within you to all who are in this personal circle of your life.

I think this little ritual is not only a great way to begin a new calendar year – or church year – but an intentional way of remembering every day of every year: each of us has the Light of Christ, the Christ-Star...within us....and this Light....is to be shared......in this season and every season of our lives!

The Little Season of Christmas

The twelve days of Christmas from December 25 through January 5 are our opportunity to celebrate God's greatest gift to us and the hope that he brings into a world troubled by unrest, hunger and darkness. December 26 is the festival of St. Stephen, deacon and first martyr (Acts 7). December 27 is the festival of St. John, the apostle and Gospel writer. December 28 is the day of the Holy Innocents, who were the boy children of Bethlehem killed by Herod's soldiers as they searched for the baby Jesus. On January 1st we celebrate the Name of Jesus. The days of Christmas end on January 5, Twelfth night, the Eve of the Epiphany of our Lord.
