A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

On Tuesday, June 18th, I had the pleasure of hosting the monthly meeting at St. Paul's for the Pennridge Ministerium – a gathering of colleagues and ecumenical partners in Christian ministry. The ministerium has gone back to rotating between our local churches for our meetings and the host church shares a bit of church history with the group. I printed off the history that is on our church's website and gave a copy to each one in the small group of my colleagues that came to the meeting that day. As we gathered in Fretz Hall and I shared highlights from our church history with them, I found myself once more in wonder at the rich history of St. Paul's. My deep respect of the labors of the servants of God that blazed the trail of St. Paul's formation simply grows each time I read or share Her history. In our overall discussion at the ministerium meeting – we affirmed that so many of our churches have a deep and rich history – and we remember and honor the men and women, matriarchs and patriarchs and workers - that labored in service to the Church.

But there was something else that 'popped out' to me this time – as I read our "history" - and maybe it's because of the ongoing conversations around the wonderful 'living museum' project that continues to come to life in the alcove off of Fretz Hall; what I noticed was the one line at the bottom of our history which simply states: "St. Paul's in the 21st Century is coming soon!" Our 'narrative' history is in definite need of being updated – because you, St. Paul's – have a story that goes beyond: "On New Year's Day, 2007, Reverend Patti Thomas began her pastorate. 'Pastor Patti' is the first woman pastor at St. Paul's."

We do have more to share in our story – right? There were events, activities, special services that you and I know occurred between 2007 and 2024! I know there has to be a "list" of things to record in Pastor Patti's time of serving at St. Paul's. Just in my call to serve as your pastor which began on August 5, 2019 (number 12 pastor in a 153 year history 😊 – which amazed my colleagues) there have been details that we want to make sure we record in this brief narrative that appears on our website - so many joys that I believe far exceed the concerns: a successful capital campaign (only one of two churches in our conference during a pandemic that took on such a challenge); celebrating our 150th Church Anniversary – our Sesquicentennial celebrations; the non-profits we support growing beyond FISH to providing space for a RamPacks Food Pantry and An Upper Bucks Fostering Hope "Foster Share Closet;" the installation of a fire suppression system in our church kitchen (a commercial size and equipped kitchen) that beckons us for use beyond breakfasts/brunches and two yearly fundraiser dinners. This isn't a new idea – but the idea of providing some type of meal for our community neighbors facing food insecurity would be grand – a very visible sign of Jesus' love for those in need. And the list goes on with the completion of the work needed on the bell tower and the automatic handicapped accessible doors; and the ribbon cutting ceremony held for *The Little Free Library* (so much there to build upon too as literacy mission work in our community). Maybe we need a new "We Are Family Album" too, because we remain a church family with a story and pictures to share that doesn't end in 2007. Let's celebrate today and the possibilities of what God will show us in future days!

God said, "I am the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end." God is with us! God will always be with us! Believe it! Live it! Our narrative – through God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit – will go on and on...Praise be to God!

FROM THE CONFERENCE MINISTER

Last weekend's 4 PA UCC Conference was amazing! Thank you to everyone who showed up, in person or online, at State College to experience the church at its very best! The positive spiritual energy was palpable. Thanks to our PSEC staff, volunteers, committee members, artisans, musicians, singers, worship leaders, tech folk, and especially to Sue Creswell, for all your hard work. The time together was a blessing that began with the always inspiring Rev. Cean James and ended with equally inspiring UCC General Minister and President, Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson.

There is much more news to share and more opportunities for conversation and discernment about the potential future of a Keystone Conference lay ahead. For now, I want to share this story from the weekend...

Days before the event, the Penn Stater Conference Coordinator emailed our Planning Team Representative (PTR) asking for information about the UCC. She wanted to prepare her Penn Stater staff with some knowledge about their guests.

On Saturday, the Conference Coordinator shared with our PTR that our UCC delegates were the most kind and caring group that The Penn Stater hosted during her long tenure -- a sentiment shared by the entire staff. The following day, she shared that when our UCC contract was given to her, she didn't want it. Her faith experience growing up was not good and she felt like she was the least capable candidate for a church conference contract. She explained that her husband was raised in church and has been wanting to find a local faith community, but she has been very reluctant. She just could not bring herself to give church another try. Until now.

After meeting almost 500 UCC people, she said that she was overcome by how we not only talk about our faith but walk our faith. She wanted more information about local UCC churches from our PTR when standing next to her was Rev. Jes Kast, Pastor, Faith UCC in State College. Rev. Jes's extravagant, hospitable, welcome in that moment was just what was needed to open the door of possibility and hope. It was a moment that had the Conference Coordinator telling this story of acceptance and connection in tears with those fortunate enough receive it.

I began the Conference meeting wondering with the representatives of each Conference board what miracle we were going to see during the weekend. This was just one.

Thanks be to God. Great and small, miracles happen. Everyday.
