



#### KIDS SUMMER LUNCH PROGRAM

It's back! The Kids Summer Lunch Program through Pennridge FISH will again be offered to clients this summer. The program had not been offered the last two years due to Covid and a program that had been available through the state for parents to assist them with feeding their children over the summer. That program through the state is no longer available so FISH will be undertaking their program again.

So as you are shopping this summer for your vacation or having things on hand for the kids or grandkids, take a look at how you can assist FISH with their Kids Summer Lunch Program.

In the summer, FISH is preparing extra shopping bags for families with school age children who will need lunch while home this summer. During the year, many of these families receive reduced lunches for their children in their schools but during the summer this is not available and the families need to supply extra food to feed the kids during this time. We would like to aid FISH in supplying some of these items to fill the bags they will be giving out to these families.

In past years, I had put up the Giving Tree with tags of food items needed for this program but I have decided to change it up this year. There will be Summer Lunch sheets listing the items needed in the weekly bulletin so that you can carry it with you to the grocery store and leave on the refrigerator to remind you to remember this program each week. If you prefer to make a monetary donation instead of making a purchase, please place your gift in a Special envelope marked Summer Lunch for FISH and see that I get it for delivery to them. Don't place in the offering collection slot but see that it is given to me. Checks can be made out to Pennridge FISH.

This collection will continue through the month of July into mid August so if you are away, don't worry...bring your items to church when you return! When you bring in your donations, you can place them in bags marked Summer Lunch for Kids that you can find in the back of the church, in either the vestibule, Narthex or Sanctuary. Find a bag with some room and place your items inside. If all the bags are full, (that would be a big YAY!) just set it next to a filled bag and it will be taken care of.

# What's Cooking at St. Paul's

RECIPE FOR: Dave Wagner's Apple Salad

1 bag of Romaine 3/4 c. craisins

1 c. cashews

1 granny smith apple, unpeeled, sliced thin

½ c. red onion

1/4 c. crumbled blue cheese

#### **Dressing**

½ c. sugar

½ c. veg. oil

1/4 apple cider vinegar

1/4 tsp. garlic salt

1/4 tsp. celery salt

Add the apples about 30 minutes before serving and pour the dressing on at that time.

\*I tripled the recipe when I made it for a crowd. I used 2 big heads of curly green lettuce instead of the bagged Romaine.)

RECIPE FOR: Spinach Strawberry Salad

FROM: Nancy Moyer

Serving Size: 4

#### Salad

1 bunch baby spinach, washed and dried

1 quart strawberries, sliced

1 2 oz. pkg sliced almonds

1 or 2 small cans of Mandarin orange slices, drained

### **Poppy Seed Dressing**

½ c. sugar

½ c. cider vinegar

1 ½ teaspoon chopped onion

1/4 teaspoon paprika

1/4 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce

½ c. vegetable oil

1 tablespoon poppy seeds

Salad -Wash and dry spinach-add strawberries, MANDARIN ORANGE SLICES, died blueberries or cranraisins and almonds

**Dressing** - Combine first five ingredients in blender. (I leave out the onions - too much bother for 1 1/2 teaspoon of onion.) Process for 30 sec., scrape sides, blend at high, and gradually add oil. Stir in poppy seeds with spoon.

Toss salad with dressing before serving.
