



A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

As we wander through this season of Lent, our path will continue to lead us to our Palm Sunday Parade and into Holy Week to the upper room as the disciples shared in the last supper with Jesus, to Jesus kneeling and washing the disciples feet, to denial, to betrayal, to desertion, to crucifixion, to the day of new beginnings with the glorious resurrection of Jesus – the celebration of that first Easter morning with the Living Savior we serve!

In our time of Sunday worship during the church season of Lent and into Easter Day and the Second Sunday of Easter – we will continue to study Peter's faith journey. As you've read and heard before, he is described as a person who is both steadfast and unsteady, a dear friend and a betrayer, a follower and a wanderer. As Sanctified Art, our Lenten resource, was studying Peter's faith journey, the lyrics of "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing" came to mind. They state: It's as if Peter himself wrote this song. And so, for each step in Peter's journey, we have selected a phrase from this hymn. The selected phrase will also be given attention each Sunday as we worship in these Holy seasons of the church year!

We sang "Come, O Fount of Every Blessing" (as titled in our New Century Hymnal) when we worshiped together on Ash Wednesday evening; and we will sing this hymn once more when we gather for our Maundy Thursday/Good Friday evening worship experience. As we reflect deeper on our individual faith journeys, I think it serves us well to consider the history of the writing of the originally titled hymn, "Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing" by Robert Robinson.

Robert's life had a difficult beginning. His father died when he was young. His mother was unable to 'control' his unruly behavior. She sent him away to London to be schooled in barbering. However, once there he got involved in drinking and gang-life. At age seventeen, he and his friends had an experience that left Robert feeling unsettled and he was drawn to attend an evangelistic meeting being held by George Whitefield. Whitefield is described as one of history's greatest preachers, with 'a voice that was part foghorn and part violin.' The message preached that night led Robert to immediately get sober. Whitefield's words stayed with Robert for nearly three years – and finally in 1755, Robert gave his heart to Christ and he soon entered the ministry. Three years later, at age twenty-three, while serving Calvinist Methodist Chapel in Norfolk, England, he wrote a hymn for his sermon on Pentecost Sunday. The hymn is described as a prayer that the Holy Spirit flood into our hearts with His streams of mercy, enabling us to sing God's praises and remain faithful to Him.

Come wander with Peter, also described as one of Jesus most famous disciples – hear his stories of "the ups" and "downs" he experienced on his faith journey as he truly walked this earth with our Savior. Come wander through the select phrases of "Come, O Fount of Every Blessing" as we gather for worship throughout Lent, Holy Week, and the season of Easter – and as we remember the hymn writer's story – and his faith journey. No matter who you are, or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here. God is with us on the winding path! We journey together!


