November 2 | 21st All Saints Sunday

Text: Luke 20:27-38 Sermon: Like the Angels

Sometimes we like to think of those who have died as becoming angels and getting their wings. But that is not exactly what Jesus taught. We will also recognize members of St. Paul's who have served their country in uniform on this Sunday before Veteran's Day.

November 16 | 23rd Sunday after Pentecost

Text: Isaiah 65:17-25 Sermon: Imagine There's New Heaven

In a bleak time the Prophet Isaiah was moved by God to prophesy about a new heaven and a new earth. His powerful words help us imagine a world in which there is no longer sin and hatred and suffering.

November 23 | 24th Sunday after Pentecost

This is the last Sunday of the liturgical year. The cycle begins with Advent and the preparation for the coming of the Messiah. The cycle ends with Jesus the Messiah recognized as reigning over all of creation.

November 26 | Thanksgiving Eve Ecumenical service

Members of St. Agnes Roman Catholic Church, St. Michael's Lutheran Church, and Jerusalem Lutheran will join us at St. Paul's for an ecumenical service of giving thanks. November 30 | 1st Sunday of Advent (Year A) / Communion

Text: Matthew 24:36-44 Sermon: Keep Watch!


