FROM THE PASTOR

All Saints Day is observed by the Western Church on November 1 and is generally celebrated in worship on the first Sunday in November. In the Protestant tradition, All Saints Day and All Souls Day (November 2) are times to remember those who have passed on, particularly those who have shaped our faith. At St. Paul's, we will be celebrating All Saints Sunday on November 3rd during our 10:15am worship service. Included in the worship service will be the reading of the names of loved ones within our church membership that passed away since November 2023 and a candle will be lighted in memory of the loved one. The congregation will also have an opportunity to name family and/or friends that have passed away over the past year and also light a candle in memory of their friend/family member.

One of my favorite Scripture passages I think of as *All Saints Day* approaches is Hebrews 12:1-2 ~ "So then, with endurance, let's also run the race that is laid out in front of us, *since we have such a great cloud of witnesses surrounding us*. Let's throw off any extra baggage, get rid of the sin that trips us up, ² and fix our eyes on Jesus, faith's pioneer and perfecter. He endured the cross, ignoring the shame, for the sake of the joy that was laid out in front of him, and sat down at the right side of God's throne." When I think of the 'saints' – I think of the 'great cloud of witnesses surrounding us'; I think of those that have gone before us in the faith and their trials and tribulations and how they may have responded to those challenges and struggles.

The Book of Hebrews in my Discipleship Study Bible is described as addressing people who have been Christians for some time now, but who find that their earlier enthusiasm has faded and that their faith commitment is on the wane. Hebrews aims to rekindle their vision. And Jesus, in this book of Hebrews, is described as a trailblazer, a pioneer, who leads us to faith's destination – who draws us toward our home with God. We read Hebrews 12:2 again which says, 'and fix our eyes on Jesus, faith's pioneer and perfecter.'

The major purpose of Hebrews is to encourage, strengthen, and motivate its readers – to call them to faithfulness. I'm so thankful for the 'great cloud of witnesses surrounding us.' I'm thankful to recognize that they too faced difficult days – just like the Hebrews did so long ago. But they persevered in the faith – just as we do today. Our scripture stories have so much to teach us – especially in a time in our world, in our nation, in our communities, in our churches – when we continue to need encouragement, strengthening and motivation in our faithfulness. Jesus has blazed the trail – a pioneer! Jesus still calls and leads us to faith's destination! Jesus is still the one who draws us toward our home with God. Praise be to God!

Many thanks from Fostering Hope for providing us the space for our foster closet at St. Paul's. On Saturday, October 12, we served 53 children – our greatest Open Shop ever! At Open Shop events we open our doors to foster families to "shop" for clothing and other supplies without having to make an appointment.

Thanks to St. Paul's for a generous donation from the Endowment Fund! This will help us to purchase big ticket items such as car seats and strollers for recently placed foster babies and toddlers.

RamPacks has started this new school year with a BANG! We are currently serving 290 children K-12 in all schools in the district. We are still working out of the three pantries (Blooming Glen Mennonite, Souderton Brethren in Christ, and here), which continues to give us many challenges.

We are so thankful for our space at St. Paul's and for the members here who serve as packers and deliverers, as well as the personal donations from members and the regular donations of snacks. We are also thankful for the generous Endowment donation we just received! That money will provide many children with weekend and holiday food.

We are looking forward to a community food drive in February. Stay tuned for more details about that.

In the meantime, keep the RamPacks mission in your prayers and all of the local churches who continue to donate regularly to support it, as well as the children who look forward to getting one every week.

The local believers tell the boys and girls about Jesus Christ – God's Greatest Gift. Many of the shoebox recipients participate in The Greatest Journey program which is a follow-up evangelism and discipleship program where the children learn more about Jesus and how to tell their family and friends about Him.
