

The 41st Annual Pennridge CROP Walk is Sunday October 13, 2024 – rain or shine. Please consider walking, rocking or donating to help end hunger. 25% of the proceeds goes to Pennridge Fish and the remaining 75% goes to Church World Service and their partner agencies for hunger in the US and globally.

Both the 5 mile walk and Golden Mile walk begin at St Andrew's Lutheran Church, 20 Dill Ave, Perkasie. Registration begins at 12:30pm and the walk begins at 1:00pm. The CROP Rock for people who want to participate but are unable to do the CROP Walk will be held at St Michael's Lutheran Church, Sellersville and St Stephen's UCC, Perkasie. It will start at 1:00pm. Please bring canned goods to donate to the Pennridge Fish pantry.

Walkers and rockers are encouraged to register online with their team – St Paul's UCC Sellersville – so people can donate online. For online donations please go to crophungerwalk.org/perkasiepa. Look for team St Paul's UCC Sellersville and the walker's or rocker's name. People can still donate with checks or cash if that is easier for them. Please make the checks to CWS/CROP and on the memo line put CROP/St Paul's.

FROM THE PASTOR

World Communion Sunday will be celebrated on October 6th! This tradition, always held on the first Sunday in October, was originally conceived by Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr of Shadyside Presbyterian Church (USA) in Pittsburgh, PA, in 1933. He had served as a moderator of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church. The U.S. Presbyterian Church adopted World Communion Sunday in 1936, then in 1940, the National Council of Churches endorsed it and promoted it to churches globally. Since that time, the practice has grown and expanded beyond denominational lines, emphasizing ecumenical partnership and unity throughout the Christian tradition.

World Communion Sunday is a celebratory Sunday that invites us to think beyond the walls of our own congregation. On this day, people around the world celebrate Communion as an act of radical unity. While we gather at our own Table to celebrate Christ's joyful feast, we will also remember, with fondness, our siblings in faith celebrating this same meal around the world.


As members of the United Church of Christ, on October 6th, World Communion Sunday, we will also celebrate the presentation of our Neighbors in Need Special Mission Offering which supports ministries of justice and compassion in the United States. In 2024, the Neighbors In Need theme is "Mental Health Justice For All!" This year's focus is on Mental Health Justice. In 2015, the General Synod of the United Church of Christ passed a resolution to become WISE (Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Engaged) for mental health.

A just world for all is a world where the human rights and well-being of people with mental health challenges are respected, no matter who you are or where you are in life's mental health journey. Thank you for your generosity and support of our Neighbors in Need Special Mission Offering.

So, mark the date and time: Sunday, October 6th, 10:15am, World Communion Sunday worship celebration with the presentation of our generous Neighbors in Need Special Offering. THE KEYSTONE PROJECT

Greetings! The **Keystone Conference vote will be taken on November 9th**. It is a wonderful opportunity for each congregation to send 2 delegates, along with all authorized ministers to our Fall Meeting, whether in person at St. Thomas in Harrisburg, at various watch parties in our Associations, or from the comfort of your own home.

Our meeting on November 9th is pivotal. We will discuss three key agenda items to inform the ministry of our conference: the **2025 PCC budget**, a resolution to General Synod concerning **Rural and Small Town Churches (STAR)**, and a formal motion to General Synod proposing the **formation of one united Keystone Conference of the United Church of Christ**. Each congregation's participation is vital as we foster unity and collaboration across the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

There are Sunday morning bulletin inserts that will be shared and available in order to ensure The Keystone Conference shared purpose resonates throughout our congregations.

Registration for Nov. 9th will be announced soon. Registration is already open for the **Fall Town Halls**! There is a QR code on the inserts. *Let's work together to inspire active participation and meaningful dialogue around these significant matters*!

Keystone Project Transition Timeline

Dear participants of the PA UCC Spring Meeting -

You requested more information on aspects of the Keystone Project, and we heard you! Please find our <u>Transitional Timeline attached to this message</u>. We hope this will provide some clarity about what would happen next if all the Conferences vote to pass the Motion for the creation of a Keystone Conference.

Please keep the following things in mind as you review the timeline:

- 1. **This timeline is evolving**. More information will be added to it in the next few months including timeframes for financial decisions, sale of real estate, office location, legal paperwork submission, and the like. New versions will be released on a regular basis.
- 2. **The full transition of four Conferences into one takes several years**. A crew of transitional staff is necessary to carry the work of the new Conference into and through its first year, especially as a transitional Board is getting established. The timeline for staff transitions (current to transitional to settled) is a dynamic operation and we will adapt as needed.
- 3. Following the official start of the Keystone Conference (01/01/2026) there will remain four 'skeletal' boards of the original conferences. At this point the current four Conferences will come to be the "Historic Penn Northeast Conference" etc. This is necessary as we move toward financial integration, which will happen over the following few years.
- 4. All our significant timeline decisions are made with the knowledge and counsel of the National setting of the UCC, including our General Counsel, Heather Kimmel.
